Notice of adoption of the Environmental Quality Supplementary Planning Document (SPD3)

On the 10th of May 2019 Kingston upon Hull City Council adopted the Environmental Quality Supplementary Planning Document (SPD3). This SDP has been prepared to guide applicants through the planning process to ensure that Hull's physical environment is not harmed by a planning proposal and that any significant adverse impacts of a development scheme are addressed at the most appropriate stage of the planning process.
