A look into what's been happening within Hull City Council's Managed Workspace Centres

Refurbishment works have been ongoing at our North Hull Centre, and with the ground floor now completed, contractors KWL have moved onto the first floor to commence upgrades there. The Centre has already seen new additions such as a communal kitchen and shower room, as well as improved carpets, lighting, and ceilings. Bespoke has also received it's first enquiries since coming under the Managed Workspace Centres umbrella.

As part of continued upgrade works, a new intercom system has been installed in our West Hull Centre. The new system makes it easier for visitors to the Centre to get in touch with licensees, especially outside of reception hours. Licensees can also be set up with codes which they can pass on to their visitors, giving them access to the rear lobby area and a comfortable place to wait when reception is closed.







Our Centre in the East of the City also acquired a makeover in the last quarter as the entire building received a fresh paintjob, giving it a newer, sleeker appearance for licensees and visitors to the Centre. Craven Park has also seen a number of businesses expand within the Centre, with MS Electrical, Arrow Driving Academy, and Redfez Ltd all moving into larger offices.





Yorkshire Safety Training: From Redundancy to Prosperity

Being made redundant can be a very stressful situation and can have longstanding effects on anyone who goes through it, especially during times of economic uncertainty like what has been seen in the last eighteen months. But while it may have many negative connotations, redundancy can also be an opportunity — an opportunity to use the skills you have to forge yourself a new path.

One such person who took full advantage of this opportunity is Paul Beharrell, co-founder and co-director of Yorkshire Safety Training Ltd who moved into Craven Park Training and Enterprise Centre in October 2020 after being made redundant from another job in the same industry. Although predominantly focussing their training courses on the construction industry, Yorkshire Safety Training Ltd also offer health and safety training courses for other sectors including retail, warehouse, chemical, transport, and engineering.

"I had previously worked in various roles giving advice on training and grants to employers taking on apprentices and also for training courses." Paul said. "I also helped set up employers to become NVQ centres and devised assessor and IV and centre packs for them to gain accreditation. I took redundancy in 2016 after 20 years and then worked for another training provider for

3 years. With Furlough, then came a second redundancy in 2020. So twice in 5 years. I had a lot of customers come to me and say, 'Why not set up by yourself?' So, I did."

Soon after moving into the East Hull Managed Workspace Centre, the company became an Approved Training Organisation (ATO) of the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB), meaning that any construction company registered with CITB can get their CITB grants automatically by using an approved CITB ATO centre.

It wasn't all easy going however, as the second wave of Coronavirus restrictions hit just as the company started to run courses, delaying things for them as they had to take time to be Covid compliant and get permission from an awarding body in order to continue to run their courses. After receiving this approval though, they were able to continue their operations throughout the pandemic, and Yorkshire Safety Training have thrived to help key workers stay up to date with their qualifications, thus keeping them in employment. Due to offering 'Open Classroom' courses in a training environment with face-to-face interaction between tutor and students, the company has received praise from employers and staff alike who have attended their training courses.

The company also offers in-house training on company premises and a range of courses, while also being able to design bespoke specific courses to customer requirements including the likes of Working at Heights, Manual Handling, Safety Harness Training, and many more.

"We are now about to offer IOSH (institution of Occupational Safety and Health) 3 Day Managing Safely courses. This is an internationally recognised qualification, which will allow us to promote to new markets. We also have more exciting news in the next few months on other qualifications that we will be offering to help us expand even further."

Bespoke Centre



After coming under the management of the Managed Workspace Centres team in 2019, Bespoke Centre is now undergoing a major refurbishment, bringing it in line with the other buildings in the team's portfolio.

Bespoke Centre is set to become the newest place to be for SMEs looking for office space in North Hull. After originally opening in the early 2000s as a community centre, the building has been overhauled in order to bring in the next generation of entrepreneurs within the local area, with works including improved lighting, new floors and walls, and additional offices being created. Changes can be seen as soon as you take your first steps into

the building, with the reception area looking brighter and more vibrant thanks to a new carpet and upgraded lighting.

Electrical contractors KVVL commenced with the works in May, stripping the ground floor of the building to its bare bones in order remove existing electrics, ceilings and mechanics to replace them with improved systems. The creation of a 24/7 access door, communal kitchen and shower room was added to accommodate the needs of small businesses that may not follow a 'normal' working day, while the on-site meeting room gives

conferences and meetings with their clients. The reception area also previously featured a walkway and entrance to the on-site nursery, but this has now been blocked up to give the nursery more independence and privacy, whilst also creating a professional atmosphere for the Managed Workspace Centre.

Moving onto the first floor, the improved lighting and flooring continues, whilst you can also see the creation of new offices to maximise the number of small businesses that can be supported in the area and bringing the total number of units within the Centre to 23. Something else that has been constructed on

the first floor is the breakout area and another communal kitchen in order to give owners and staff of SMEs the spaces to comfortably have a break.

Despite the refurbishment works still ongoing, the Centre has already received its first enquiries, and is ready to take many more, with all of our latest vacancies now being listed on our website. The works have also been welcomed by businesses currently based at the Centre, with licensees complementing the improvements to the building.

The original community aspects of the building have not been forgotten however, as Bespoke Centre is to be primarily focused at third sector SMEs, charities, and social enterprises.

In 2019 Jemma Wright established J.V. Wright Ltd, which has quickly become one of the leading providers of training and education in the Yorkshire and Humber regions, as well as the whole of England. When Jemma founded the company, she had originally intended for their focus to be on management training, but soon started receiving enquiries about health & social care and first aid courses, especially once Coronavirus restrictions had started to be put in place. Due to this, and previous experience with first aid training and health & social care, Jemma saw this as an opportunity to pivot the business and now delivers training in Business Skills, First Aid, Health & Social Care, and Leadership & Management, among other topics, while priding itself on helping to develop and improve people and organisations. Less than two years on, J.V. Wright now employs a team of 6 staff and 4 associates.

Now Jemma has taken on a new challenge, one which is exceptionally close to her heart, branching out and forming The Northern Care Company. The seeds for this were first sown during the first nationwide lockdown period in Spring 2020 when Jemma found herself working from the home of her partner's mother who had fallen ill, in order to support her and care for her, as well as organising other care providers involved.

It was during this time that she saw there were some areas for improvement in the levels of care provided, even down to basic things such as cooking meals and changing bedding and decided to create her own company to ensure that people can receive good quality care and support by employing a team who are well trained and looked after and supported effectively in their roles. "Because of the link with health and social care training, I felt passionately that it's not difficult to put that right."

Jemma says.

"It's not difficult to give people the right quality training quality training to do the job well. Anybody receiving care in their own home should receive the highest quality of care and feel safe."

Unfortunately, Jemma's partner's mother sadly passed away in April 2021, but this spurred her on to get the ball rolling on the issue feels strongly about, and thus The Northern Care Company was born. Jemma's first act was to employ Karen Everitt as Head of Care, who has years of experience in the sector, to help her in her develop the business.

Currently serving clients in West Hull villages such as Cottingham, North Ferriby and Swanland, as well as North Lincolnshire villages like Barton, Jemma has her eyes set on growing the company's service area out into the East Riding of Yorkshire, whilst also expanding the services that The Northern Care Company provides. At the moment the company currently offers services including companionship, grocery shopping, home help, and cleaning, and have recently submitted their application to the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to become a registered care provider, being able to offer the full range of care services to their clients. Once this has been achieved, Jemma's next goal will be to form the best team of care workers she can, training them up to reach the high standard that she has already set. "I don't want any of our clients at The Northern Care Company to feel that they've got someone who doesn't know what they're doing."


