## WHO ARE WE?

Connexions are an information, advice and guidance service for 14 to 18 year olds.

We provide specialist information, advice and guidance on education, training and employment opportunities available in the local area.

If you are over 18 or you have an Education Health and Care Plan, then we may still be able to support you or refer you for specialist support through other agencies we work with.

## WHY DO WE CONTACT YOU?

We contact every 16 to 18 year old in Hull;

 Hull City Council has statutory responsibilities, set by central government to establish if you are in Education, Training or Employment and take details of this to put on your individual record.

This information is used to show the number of young people who are currently in education, training or employment, in order to establish unemployment numbers for this age range in the city. This information also allows us to identify any gaps in training/courses available for young people and to help develop new opportunities for the future. We follow Data Protection guidelines so no personal information is shared.

 We offer support to those who still need to find education, training or employment through providing advice and guidance on chosen career options or support you if you are undecided.

The support we provide is optional and can be refused but you STILL NEED to inform us of this decision so that we can put a note on your record.

If you do refuse and change your mind, become unemployed, leave a course/training you can contact us for support at any time, providing you are still aged between 16 and 18 years old.











## **Re-engagement Programmes**

## **Brief Description**

Re-engagement programmes are supportive programmes, designed to help you build confidence, learn and experience new skills such as team working, employability skills, taster different career areas.

This is a good starting point if you; have not been in education or training for a while and would like to build your confidence and find out what skills you have and taster different options in a supportive way.

### **Duration**

Can vary depending on individual circumstances.

## **Study Programmes within Smaller Training Centre**

### **Brief Description**

A programme that combines gaining a qualification in certain vocational area alongside gaining a Maths and English qualification, if you do not already have grade 4 or above (Level 2).

It also includes, enrichment activities that are tailored to the individual's needs, for example work experience.

This is a good starting point; if you would prefer learning in a smaller training environment rather than a College environment. If you have no qualifications and would like to gain a qualification in a vocational area for example, Business administration and gain a qualification in Maths and English (either GCSE or Functional skills) alongside this.

### **Duration**

1 year

## **Money Matters**

You can apply for a bursary. This Programme qualifies for Child Benefit/Tax Credits.

### What can this lead to?

Further Study, Traineeship, Apprenticeship or Employment.

## **Traineeship**

### **Brief Description**

A work focused Programme that focuses on you gaining work experience with an employer in your chosen career area. Completing employability skills and improving on your existing Maths and English qualification (if needed) to level 2.

This is a good starting point if you; are struggling to find an apprenticeship or employment due to lack of employability skills, work experience or would like to gain level 2 in your English, Maths and Digital skills.

### **Duration**

6 weeks to 1 year (although most last 6 months)

### **Money Matters**

You can apply for a bursary. This Programme qualifies for Child Benefit and Tax Credits.

### What can this lead to?

Apprenticeship or Employment

## **Brief Description**

Apprenticeships combine practical training in a job with study working towards a Level 2 qualification in a specific career area (i.e. construction, hospitality, Business Administration).

A good starting point if you have the necessary qualifications and skills for the apprenticeship and are certain of your career idea.

## **Entry Qualifications**

Apprenticeships are level 2 qualifications so you will need to have achieved Level 2 (Grade 4 or above) in English and Maths. Other qualifications and skills needed will be outlined by the employer and the Training Provider/College.

### **Duration**

1 to 2 year

## **Money Matters**

You will receive an apprentice wage.

### What can this lead to?

Advanced Apprenticeship or Employment





## **Full-time College**

### **Brief Description**

Colleges have a wide range of Study Programme/Vocational and Academic courses available (look at College prospectus or website for more information on what is offered and what qualifications are needed).

This is a good starting point if you; are looking at doing academic subjects for example, A-Levels, T – Levels and certain GCSE re-sits.

If you are looking at doing a higher level course of study (Level 2, 3) or alternatively you have no qualifications and would like to gain a qualification in a specific vocational area alongside a qualification in Maths and English (Study Programme).

## **Entry Qualifications**

Course levels range from not needing any qualification to needing specific qualifications depending on chosen course and level of course.

### **Duration**

1 to 2 year

### **Money Matters**

You can apply for a bursary. Full Time courses qualify for Child Benefit/Tax Credits

#### What can this lead to?

Further study, Traineeship, Apprenticeship or Employment

### Myth

I haven't got any qualifications, but I should easily get an apprenticeship

### **Fact**

It's quite difficult to find an apprenticeship without having any qualifications or previous experience, but there are a variety of programmes available that will help you to prepare and will give you a better chance with future applications.

### Myth

Now I am 16 years old and have left School, I don't need to do anything

### **Fact**

The 'Raising of the Participation Age' Act states that you should be in some form of education, training or employment up to the age of 18 years old.

## **Myth**

I'll just find work in a factory or supermarket

## **Fact**

While you are under 18 there are very few jobs around in certain workplaces, as because of your age there are health and safety laws in place designed to protect you, but also restrict some environments where you can work.

## **Myth**

I can only apply for one course / one apprenticeship at a time

## **Fact**

You can apply for as many courses as you would like at different Colleges or Training Providers before deciding on your final choice. You can apply for as many Apprenticeship opportunities as you would like before deciding on your final choice.
