Community Action Day

In June, we held a Community Action Day. This was in response to a number of burglaries in the St Nicholas Avenue and Graham Avenue areas. Days such as these provide an opportunity for partners, including the police, Neighbourhood Team and other organisations active in the community to work together on a specific project.

During the day we completed door to door visits, offering people the opportunity to sign up to My Community Alerts www.mycommunityalert, a free messaging system operated by Humberside Police, which gives you live information about incidents happening in your area.

We also fitted shed, window, and door alarms In total on the Community Action Day we:

- visited 200 properties
- spoke to residents living in 40% of households the area
- fitted 52 shed alarms
- fitted 20 window alarms
- made six referrals for smoke alarms
- signed up 34 residents for My Community Alerts





The day helped to identify where vulnerable people were living and gave residents a chance to raise other areas of concern such as fly-tipping and we also spoke to people interested in setting up a Neighbourhood Watch group.

Problem motorbikes

Again, we have had problems with motorbikes and anti-social behaviour on Bethune and Sibelius Road. Calls to the police and council were especially high in March and April.



Operation Yellowfin swung into action. This is the police's campaign to clampdown on motorbike crime, and involves the police working with partner agencies. There is now a higher police presence on the streets. After two weeks, calls to the police were down by 50 per cent.

It is always important to report these incidents to the police as it provides valuable intelligence and helps to stamp out crime. Just phone 101.

Changes to Gower Park

We've been successful in getting money to modernise Gower Park and we have consulted residents on what they would like in the park, especially those who used the old skate park. The skate park had to be closed for safety reasons and has now been transformed into a MUGA with lighting. It's good to see how popular it has become since it opened at Easter.



Project Clean Streets

Project Clean Streets has been working in the area to the north of Boothferry Road, edging all the grass verges and cutting back the overgrown old garage site on Sibelius Road.

Help prevent fires in Pickering

Recently, there has been a number of fires in the ward, particularly involving wheelie bins. A replacement bin costs residents £36, so we are encouraging people to lock their bins away once they have been emptied.

A fly- tipped mattress in Tilbury Street was recently set alight, bulky items can be collected by the council. Residents are entitled to up to one collection of five bulky items free of charge during a 12-month period. All you have to do is complete and send the form on the council's website.

Over the last few weeks, Humberside Fire and Rescue Service have attended fires caused by washing machines, tumble driers and dishwashers, they are warning people not to run them if you are out of the house.
