Warm Spaces for you

There's no need to be cold and lonely this winter

The sharp increase in the cost for energy is affecting everyone, with many of us choosing to turn down the heating in our homes. Recognising this, as part of the council's cost of living campaign, #HullTogether, the council and other organisations have set up Warm Spaces across the city where people are welcome to spend time and enjoy some company for free. All council supported spaces have safeguarding policies in place.

There are Warm Spaces across the city in a wide range of locations and venues, such as libraries, community centres and church halls. You'll get a warm welcome and usually a warm drink too! Some spaces may be offering activities such as keep fit exercises or free internet use, advice and support on budgeting or cooking cheap nutritious meals. Everyone is welcome to attend, either alone or with family or friends. You can just come along for a chat.

You can find your nearest Warm Space on the interactive map on Hull City Council's website, which also shows the locations for community food providers and fairtrade points. This map is updated regularly as more locations are added to the list.

From hull.gov.uk choose the link at the top to My Hull Maps. Under the My Maps tab you will find lots of helpful links in the Local Information section, like where to find Warm Spaces, Food Banks, free internet access, etc.

Kingswood Community Centre

The Centre is based in Ashcombe Road, Kingswood Retail Park and from around February 2023* will be available to hire for meetings, events and other activities.

The large hall will be available to hire and has a capacity of 100 people. There will be a small meeting room available to hire from June 2023 which has a capacity of 20.

There is a small kitchen in the small meeting room where there's a boiler to make hot drinks and a washing up sink. Please note there are no cooking facilities in this building. There is a vending machine that offers, coffee, tea and hot chocolate at £1.50 per drink.

There will be a parent and toddler group (0-3 year olds) running at the community centre during the week.

Youth Hub

The Hub that will run on a Tuesday and Thursday evening that will be run by New Life Support.

The aim of New Life Support is to improve the lives of young people and their families across East Yorkshire. It offers open access youth hubs for young people aged 11-16.

The Kingswood Youth Hub operates a drop-in centre for two sessions a week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6-8pm. It has a pool table, a table tennis table, games consoles, a computer, board games and offers other activities such as art resources and competitions such as karaoke.

The Kingswood Youth Hub:

- provides 1:1 support for those young people attending
- gives young people a place to go and things to do
- helps young people to gain new experiences and skills to improve their self-esteem
- facilitates workshops, such as DJ skills and video production has staff which encourages small, special interest groups through which young people can share and talk about their experiences
- empowers young people through offering information and advice
- facilitates holistic wellbeing and support through trained staff and volunteers
- provides free activities for young people in the area

We are hoping the Youth Hub will be open and operational early 2023.

Revive Church



There is also a church service at the community centre led by the Revive Church which meets every Sunday morning from 10.30am for worship, prayer and bible teaching. There's also a programme for children aged 4-11. The Revive Church sees itself as a family where everyone is welcome, and it believes passionately that the good news of Jesus is still a message of hope and healing in a sometimes confusing world.


Minimum standards for energy efficiency

Did you know that if you rent your home privately your landlord must provide a valid Energy Efficiency Performance Certificate which has to rate between 'A' and 'E'?

It is illegal to rent a property which rates 'F' or 'G' and landlords which don't provide a certificate for rented properties rated 'F' or 'G' can face fines of up to £5,000.

The higher the EEPIC rating, the more money you will save on your heating bills, and you will be much warmer and more comfortable.

So, if you rent a property, or are the landlord, and it rates an 'F' or 'G' EEPIC, or the property doesn't have a rating, for more information contact Hull City Council's Private Housing team on housing.standards@hullcc.gov.uk


