Priority 3 - To improve the cleanliness of local environment

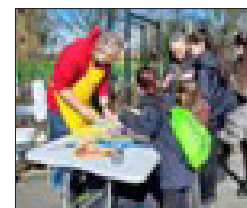
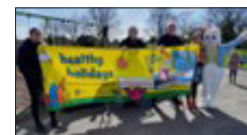
And as a result of discussions with residents at the event, it was agreed that a fourth priority to be adopted for 2024 - 25 would be parking.

Grasby Easter Eggstravaganza

On Saturday 23 March, we hosted an Easter event on Grasby Park. We were pleased to be joined by the team from Max Life Youth Project based within Kingston Wesley Church on Holderness Road and members of Wolfpack Theatre Company.



Thanks to the support from the Healthy Holidays Hull programme, we were able to provide free healthy pack lunches for 100 children, as well as activities including an Easter egg hunt with the Easter Bunny, sports and games as well as an activity giving the children and young people the opportunity to make their own healthy fruit kebabs. Our colleagues Living with Water were on hand to speak to families about water saving and flood mitigation techniques that are easy to adopt into everyday life as well as providing activities for the children in attendance.

Neighbourhood Drop in's Ings Library

A message from Humberside Police - nuisance motorcycles

Illegal motorcycle activity is a source of reoccurring complaints from local communities, neighbourhoods and individual residents. The criminal and anti-social use of motorcycles can negatively impact the sense of local community safety and quality of life, while also, in some cases, pose a danger to riders and also the wider community.

Operation Yellowfin is a diverse problem-solving initiative across the Humberside Police area targeting the criminal and anti-social use of motorcycles across our communities in conjunction with partner agencies.

Hull Maritime summer programme

This summer, the Hull Maritime Project in partnership with Yorkshire Wildlife Trust and Living With Water will be hosting a series of sessions in the east of the city that look at the wildlife, ecology and wetland environment of the Humber Estuary. Try your hand at making seagrass bags to be used to help to restore the Humber's natural environment or have a go at building your own river system and find out what human actions can have on the functioning of our precious waterways. Participants will also have the chance to find out about the mysterious lost town of Ravenser Odd, once trade rival to Hull and Grimsby, which disappeared beneath the waters of the Humber 650 years ago.

In October half term there will also be the opportunity for a limited number of participants to take part in a 'Unimog Safari' at Spurn point where they will be able to see the wonderful wildlife they have been learning about in its natural environment.

Living with Water - water butt giveaway

Living With Water aims to help build understanding across Hull and the East Riding about the threats and opportunities water brings to our region.



It is a partnership between Yorkshire Water, Hull City Council, East Riding of Yorkshire Council, the Environment Agency and the University of Hull - all of which play a role in managing water in Hull and the East Riding.

As Living With Water, they are working together to build flood resilience, develop innovative water management systems, and highlight our region as a great place to live, work and visit.

The partnership are currently working with the Ings ward community to give away free water butts. Subject to availability, they are looking for residents who can connect up a water butt to their downpipes, to mitigate surface water flooding and save water.
